

Overview



Patient Satisfaction

87% reported being very satisfied or somewhat satisfied with treatment.



Across all six programs, only 1% of patients reported being "very unsatisfied" with their treatment.

Readmission Rates

For those who completed treatment at MBH programs, only **3.2% were readmitted to MBH within 12 months**, **MUCH LOWER** than the industry average.



Mental Health & Trauma

The majority of Meadows IOP/VIOP patients (84%) reported moderate to severe symptoms for at least one mental disorder at intake.





Rates of PTSD/Trauma at Admission







Progress During Treatment


Overall Feeling

Patients who reported feeling poor or terrible went from 64% at intake to 12% by the end of treatment




Severe Anxiety

Decreased from 68% at intake to 30% by the end of treatment




Suicidal Thoughts With Some Intention

Decreased from 12% at intake to 2% by the end of treatment




Severe or Moderately Severe Depression

The Participants:


Vista Research Group received intake data from 1,616 patients who attended treatment at Meadows IOP/VIOP between August 1, 2022, and September 30, 2023.

Locations:

Participants included patients in Meadows in-person IOP programs in Dallas, Texas; Silicon Valley, California; and Scottsdale, Arizona; as well as VIOP programs in Texas, California, and Arizona.

Ethnicity Breakdown

Forty-three percent of the patients (43%) were single and had never married, while 37% were married. The majority of patients were White (71%), and 10% were Hispanic/Latino.

Mark Baumgartner's clinical and leadership career spans more than three decades and covers a broad range of the substance use disorder and mental health treatment continuum. In March 2021, he joined the Meadows Behavioral Healthcare team to provide leadership for the expansion of their world-class treatment programs into the virtual outpatient environment. Soon after, he was named vice president of outpatient services. In that role, he's seen program offerings grow to include nine outpatient centers alongside virtual IOP options in nine states, bringing the Meadows Model and MBH's trauma-focused approach to more people.

Baumgartner spent more than 18 years at The Betty Ford Center, his last five as executive director. Throughout his career, he also established treatment delivery innovations to improve patient outcomes and engagement. He is a Licensed Professional Counselor and a Licensed Chemical Dependency Counselor in the state of Texas, a Licensed Professional Counselor in Arizona, a Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor in California, and a Clinical Professional Counselor in Nevada.

The Meadows Outpatient Centers, part of the Meadows Behavioral Healthcare family of treatment programs, provide treatment across the country for people grappling with challenges such as childhood and relational trauma, addiction, eating disorders, and mental health disorders. Their comprehensive eight-week curriculum emphasizes a unique trauma focus that delves into both addictive behaviors and their underlying causes, following the proven Meadows Model.

The Meadows offers intensive outpatient programs (IOP) in both in-person and virtual (VIOP) formats. This removes barriers to treatment while enabling individuals to access essential care without leaving home. The Meadows' IOP and VIOP programs cater to those appropriate for a lower level of care or transitioning from an inpatient or residential program.

This first annual Treatment Effectiveness Report for Meadows IOP/VIOP summarizes patientreported data from 1,616 patients in treatment between August 1, 2022, and September 30, 2023. This report was released on December 31, 2023.

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
